Widow Creates Life-Saving Mental Health App "Stay With Us" in Memory of Husband Lost to Suicide

Revolutionary platform helps people in crisis visualize their impact on loved ones, provides immediate access to support resources

The platform allows users to upload photos of family, friends, and loved ones, then generates personalized support messages showing how each relationship would be affected by their absence. The app provides:

- Personalized impact visualization showing ripple effects on loved ones' lives
- Crisis intervention resources including direct access to the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline
- Supportive messages tailored to specific relationships (parent, sibling, friend, partner)
- Memorial section honoring Clyfton's life and story
- Anonymous community forum for peer support

The Technology Behind Hope

Originally designed to incorporate Al-generated talking videos where uploaded loved ones would speak directly to users in crisis, the app currently focuses on powerful text-based support while technical integrations are refined. The core mission remains unchanged: showing people in their darkest moments that their lives have immeasurable value.

Growing Mental Health Crisis

With suicide rates continuing to climb nationwide, innovative approaches to mental health support are desperately needed. Traditional resources, while valuable, often fail to help individuals visualize their personal connections and impact. "Stay With Us" fills this gap by making abstract concepts of "mattering" and "belonging" tangible and personal.

Key Statistics:

- Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for ages 10-14 and 25-34
- 90% of people who die by suicide have an underlying mental health condition
- For every suicide death, there are approximately 25 suicide attempts

A Memorial That Saves Lives

The app includes a dedicated memorial page for Clyfton James Allen, ensuring his story continues to provide hope and inspiration. Users can learn about his life, his struggles, and how his memory now serves as a beacon for others facing similar challenges.

"Clyfton's death devastated our family and friends, but his story doesn't end there," his widow explained. "Every person who uses this app and chooses to stay is part of his continuing legacy."

Immediate Impact and Future Vision

Since launching, "Stay With Us" has already begun reaching people in crisis, providing both immediate crisis intervention resources and longer-term support through community features. The platform represents a new model for peer-supported mental health intervention - one that's accessible, personal, and available 24/7.

Future developments include enhanced AI integration, expanded community features, and partnerships with mental health organizations to reach more people in need.
